Each of these committees has a defined function. If there are members out there that want to get involved in any of these committees or other, just let me know.

As usual in any club of our caliber, you lose members and your gain members. We will lose five or so members from the past but we will gain an additional 10.

Each time a new member comes on board; there will be a blanket email to the present membership of introduction of the new member.

For those who are new to this----you donate \$1.00 for each three putt you have in your round, with a maximum of \$5.00. This is going to be on the honor system, therefor there will be just one person in each foursome/threesome that is assigned to mark the three putts and collect the money. We DO NOT have to have an accounting of who are contributing, just the card, and the three putt donations. Makes it easier and on the honor system.

2016 is going to be an exciting event year for RIGC. As it is appearing, we will have a full complement of players for our Match Play Championship and other championships. In all of our tournaments, the rules with qualifications will appear by email or printed on the website.

Speaking of our website, the board is looking into changing the website that would be very interactive with the membership. Everyone will be informed of any changes of our website as we move along. As the website stands now, it is stagnate until we get a new system set up and running.

The RIGC Member/Guest Invitation was a great success last year in September and we are moving forward to make the 2016 Invitation better than the last. As proven by the winning team of Wynn Miller, who came out of one of the lower flights, you can win the whole thing. In addition, speaking of that winner, Miller's team had to beat Sulucci's team on the 18<sup>th</sup> hole with a long putt to win it. Low net of the event went out to the "A" flighter-Stencel and his partner Gordy who carded a low 59.

IF anyone would like to help me and Jessie Phillips on this Invitational, let me know. We can use a half a dozen of us to do all the extras to make it a total success---THIS highlights the club to the guest.

We will be continuing our other fun things such as:

MEMBER/MEMBER and if I were you, I would be getting a commitment from my partner NOW. We had 48 of us in the event and we look forward to at least that number for 2016. Again, we will be playing out of Twin lakes and having a cookout post the tournament hosted by Ed Phillips... This will be Aug 24.
